DID YOU KNOW?

- Each year, 50 million Christmas trees are purchased in the U.S. Most of those will go to the landfill. Why not consider purchasing a potted tree this year? It will be with you for years to come, benefit your home and garden, and cut down on landfilled trees. What a holiday blessing!

- It is estimated that if every American family wrapped just three presents in reused materials, like newspapers or magazines, it would save enough paper to cover 45,000 football fields. This year, take an easy step towards reducing waste and wrap all your gifts in reusable materials.
- According to the EPA, about 40% of all battery sales occur during the holiday season. This year, consider purchasing gifts that use rechargeable batteries or, better yet, no batteries at all. Remember to properly dispose of spent batteries by taking rechargeables back to a store that sells them, or put alkaline batteries in an orange battery bag and placing it in your recycling cart.
