That's an unbelievable amount of waste for something that can easily and conveniently be sent virtually.

BEVERAGE CONTAINER RECYCLING... DONE RIGHT

No matter how you recycle, the County thanks you for your efforts. Here's a tip to maximize your recycling efforst the next time you finish a refreshing, cold beverage:

Take your aluminum, glass and plasic beverage containers to your local recycling center for a <u>cash refund</u> (5 g for containers less than 24 oz. and 10 g for containers 24 oz. or larger).

Toss your rinsed beverage containers into your <u>blue curbside</u> <u>recycling cart</u> with your other recyclables.
