DID YOU KNOW?

Sunshine and nicer weather means getting outdoors and enjoying all that Tehama County has to offer. Many of us will be camping and having BBQ's with friends and family. When it comes to your choices of party and camping supplies, consider alternatives to Styrofoam and other disposable products.

According to Washington University, **Styrofoam takes 500 years to decompose**. In Tehama County, it cannot be recycled, so the <u>Styrofoam cups</u> and other products dumped in our landfill are here to stay.

Rather than using disposables, consider **reusable dishware** whenever possible. If reusables are not an option, always choose recyclable items and be sure to rinse prior to recycling. If you are holding a small event and would like to borrow reusable dishware, the Tehama County Solid Waste Management Agency **loans out reusable dishware free of charge!** The Agency has enough dishware and utensils to accommodate a group of up to 30 people, contact us to reserve it for your next event.
