The long, hot days of summer in Tehama County can become rather miserable if you don't have an air conditioning unit in your home. Of course, those who have older models may eventually have a breakdown and need a replacement or maybe just need an upgrade. Buying a new model is easy enough, but you have to make sure that you dispose of the old one the right way. **You never want to put an AC unit in the trash or abandon an A/C unit where it can cause damage to the environment.** So, what do you do with the old unit?

Here are some suggestions:

- 1) **Have the unit repaired.** It may be possible and more cost effective to simply have your current A/C unit repaired.
- 2) **Donate it.** If the A/C unit is still functional and you are simply looking to upgrade. You will find that there are several local charities that appreciate a working unit.
- 3) **Proper disposal.** Some A/C sales and service companies may be willing to accept your old A/C unit. You may also bring the unit to the Tehama County/Red Bluff Landfill for proper, safe and professional disposal.
