DID YOU KNOW?

In 2016, Tehama County residents threw away an average of 2,026 pounds of garbage per person, of which about 72% could have been recycled or composted - that's over 1,450 pounds! That means a family of four could reduce waste by over 4,000 pounds in one year simply through recycling and composting, saving enough landfill space to fit a 36 cubic foot refrigerator.

Need more reasons to recycle? How about these:

1. Recycling saves energy.

It takes much more energy to harvest raw resources than it does to recycle them. A brand new aluminum can requires more energy to produce than 20 aluminum cans made from recycled material.

2. Recycling reduces landfills.

Recycling more lends itself to throwing away less—reducing the need for more landfills. No one wants to live next to a landfill.

3. Recycling preserves our resources and protects wildlife.

By recycling, we reduce the need to destroy habitats or harvest valuable, non-renewable resources. Recycling one ton of paper saves 17 trees.

4. Recycling is good for the economy.

Recycling and purchasing recycled products creates a greater demand for more recycled goods—a true circular economy.

BEVERAGE CONTAINER RECYCLING... DONE RIGHT


No matter how you recycle, the County thanks you for your efforts. Here's a tip to maximize your recycling efforts the next time you finish a refreshing, cold beverage:

- Take your aluminum, glass and plastic beverage containers to your local recycling center for a **cash refund** (5 ¢ for containers less than 24 oz. and 10 ¢ for containers 24 oz. or larger).
- Toss your rinsed beverage containers into your **blue curbside recycling cart** with your other recyclables.
