BEVERAGE CONTAINER RECYCLING... DONE RIGHT

No matter how you recycle, it'll save you (or pay you) precious dollars on your waste disposal bill. Consider these two recycling options the next time you finish a refreshing, cold beverage:

• Take your aluminum, glass and plasic beverage containers to your local recycling center for a <u>cash refund</u> (5 α for containers less than 24 oz. and 10 α for containers 24 oz. or larger).

 Toss your rinsed beverage containers into your <u>blue curbside</u> <u>recycling cart</u> with your other recyclables.

No matter what, you'll be reducing the overall waste you are placing in your garbage can, thereby saving you money and conserving precious resources. For more information on beverage containers elibable for a cash refund, please visit www.calrecycle.ca.gov/bevcontainer/.

DID YOU KNOW?

Americans celebrated the first Labor Day holiday with a parade, picnics and fireworks. When planning your celebration this season, consider some of these waste-reducing (and money saving) party tips:

- **Ditch disposable straws.** Straws only add expense and waste to your party. Plus, your guests will never miss them.
- Serve iced juice or water in a large communal dispenser. Not only
 is it practical and elegant, but it also eliminates the need for a cooler
 full of plastic bottles and cans. If you must have plastic bottles and
 cans, be sure to provide your guests with recycling options for the
 containers.
- Provide reusable dishware and cutlery. Remember, it's always better to **choose items that you can reuse**.
- Purchase locally sourced food and beverages. Not only will you be supporting the local economy, but locally sourced food and beverages have less packaging and transportation-associated waste.
