DID YOU KNOW?

As spring nears and many of us begin to do our annual spring cleaning, it is important for us to consider the proper options for disposing of household hazardous waste (HHW). Although these items are often just pitched in the trash, they actually pose a risk to our groundwater and land. Plus, it is illegal to put it in the garbage. Tehama County residents can utilize our HHW facilities for free proper disposal. As an added benefit, items in good

condition are redistributed for reuse through our REAP program. The dates, times and locations are noted above for drop-off events. Not sure what is classified as HHW? Here are a few examples:

- **Outside:** Products including fertilizers, pesticides, weed killers and pool chemicals.
- **Inside:** Household chemicals including nail polish remover, hair relaxers, bleach, oven cleaners, detergents, drain cleaners, and metal polishes.
- **In the Garage:** Motor oil, paint thinners, spray paint, varnishes and oil-based paints.

The Tehama County Solid Waste Management Agency provides public access to these unwanted, usable products for reuse through the REAP program (mentioned above), which stands for the REuse of Available Products. Various types of materials are available to the public **FREE** of charge. You can find more information on this program by visiting:

BEVERAGE CONTAINER RECYCLING... DONE RIGHT


No matter how you recycle, the County thanks you for your efforts. Here's a tip to maximize your recycling effort the next time you finish a refreshing, cold beverage:

- Take your aluminum, glass and plastic beverage containers to your local recycling center for a **cash refund** (5 ¢ for containers less than 24 oz. and 10 ¢ for containers 24 oz. or larger).
- Toss your rinsed beverage containers into your **blue curbside recycling cart** with your other recyclables.
