**DID YOU KNOW?**

Water heater disposal was probably not on your mind when you discovered you needed to purchase a new heater. Yet here you are with two water heaters. One brand new, and one old. **Nearly 1,800 homes in Tehama County find themselves in this dilemma annually.** Many residents choose to purchase their new heater from a company who specializes in selling and installing water heaters. If this was the route you took, chances are you won't need to worry about how to dispose of your water heater - they normally prepare and haul it away for you. However, if you're a do-it-yourself kind of person, **deciding what to do with your old heater can be a challenge.**

**Here are some options:**

**Donate it:** Many people need to upgrade their water heater because they need more hot water than their unit can deliver. If your water heater still works and is in good repair, you may be able to give it away. Contact your local charity of choice and ask if they accept working water heaters.

**Recycle it:** There are many recycling companies that will take water heaters and scrap them for the metal. Most water heater tanks are made from steel, and have copper and brass attachments. **Recycling centers will often pay you the going rate;** however, some may charge you a fee to remove the mercury switch.
