Program Highlights: Carpet Recycling

Why recycle carpet, you may wonder? Landfilled carpet is difficult to compact and takes up a lot of landfill space. It is one of the top ten most prevalent materials California landfills.

In 2010, California established the Carpet Stewardship Law, becoming the first state in the nation to establish a statewide carpet stewardship program. The program follows producer responsibility principles to ensure that discarded carpets become a resource for new products in a manner that is sustainably funded (through an environmental fee of five cents per square yard of carpet sold in the state) and provides jobs for Californians.

The Tehama County/Red Bluff Landfill collects carpet for recycling, charging Tehama County residents that segregate the carpet from their loads a reduced rate (carpet should be rolled up with the fiber side in and be free of debris and tack strips; carpet pad should be rolled up separately). By recycling our carpet in Tehama County, we save more space in our landfill. Materials recovered from carpet can be reused in new products, like traffic signs, laminate flooring, composite decking, sediment and erosion control products, and new carpet, thereby lessening our need to extract new resources from the earth. In 2014 alone, the Tehama County/Red Bluff Landfill recycled over 84,700 pounds of carpet. While recycling carpet means less revenue for our Landfill, it helps extend its life and conserves resources – a benefit for all.

DID YOU KNOW?

Waste reduction, reuse and recycling can save you time and money. Not sure where to start? **Consider this:**

The EPA estimates that grasscycling instead of bagging lawn clippings after mowing the lawn is about 38% faster. Grasscycling is the natural recycling of grass by leaving the clippings on the lawn when mowing. Grass clippings decompose quickly, returning valuable nutrients back to the soil, and mowing time is reduced since the bagging and disposal of clippings is

eliminated. **Another plus:** you won't have to spend big bucks purchasing nutrients to nourish your lawn, which saves you time and money, helps the environment and reduces waste. Now that's something we can all smile about.
