DID YOU KNOW?

Recycling one ton of cardboard saves over 9 cubic yards of landfill space and requires 24% less energy than producing virgin cardboard.



Cardboard Recycling:

Tehama County residents and businesses recycled over 2 million pounds of cardboard in 2015. That saved enough energy to power the average home for over 37 years. The oil saved from recycling that same amount of cardboard is equivalent to charging over 139,000 smartphones every day for two years. Every little bit adds up, and to ensure your cardboard and other recyclables do not end up in the landfill check out the tips below.



Cardboard Recycling Tips:

- Prepare cardboard for recycling by removing all other materials in the box such as plastic wrap, polystyrene peanuts and other packing materials.
- Break down cardboard boxes to save space in your recycling cart.
- Try to keep cardboard dry and free from food waste. Cardboard can get wet and still be recycled, but is more difficult to carry due to the added weight of the water.

As a friendly reminder the Tehama County/Red Bluff Landfill accepts cardboard and other recyclables FREE of charge, if separated from other trash. For more information on what is recyclable in Tehama County, visit www.tehamacountylandfill.com or call 528-1103.

BEVERAGE CONTAINER RECYCLING... DONE RIGHT

No matter how you recycle, the County thanks you for your efforts. Here's a tip to maximize your recycling efforts the next time you finish a refreshing, cold beverage:

- Take your aluminum, glass and plasic beverage containers to your local recycling center for a <u>cash refund</u> (5 g for containers less than 24 oz. and 10 g for containers 24 oz. or larger).
- Toss your rinsed beverage containers into your <u>blue curbside</u> recycling cart with your other recyclables.
