DID YOU KNOW?

The EPA estimates that Americans generate 1.8 million tons (that's about 11.3 pounds per person) of household hazardous waste (HHW) per year. Common HHW includes aerosols, automotive fluids, batteries, fluorescent lights, fuels, household cleaners, paints, stains, solvents, pool and spa chemicals, propane cylinders, and yard and garden products like pesticides and fertilizers. With spring cleaning just around the corner, consider making your own non-hazardous cleaning products. If you must purchase hazardous products, here are some tips to help reduce your household hazardous waste:

• Assess your needs. Before you buy a product, make sure that it will do what you want. Buy only what you need and use up what you purchase.

- Share leftover products. Give away unused portions in their original labeled containers to others that can use them. Be careful not to share products that have been contaminated or are in compromised containers.
- Dispose of unwanted products or products at its end of life properly. Do not pour leftover materials down the sink, into the sewer drains, onto the ground or put it in the trash. Instead, bring it to a FREE Household Hazardous Waste Collection event for safe disposal, recycling or reuse.
