## DID YOU KNOW?

Eventually there will come a time when your trusty and dependable dishwasher will get old. Sometimes they just need to be upgraded and other times they break down and must be replaced. Either way, you still have to get rid of the old one responsibly. So how do you recycle a dishwasher?

**Here are some suggestions:**

- **Sell it!** If your old machine is still in working condition, but you simply wanted to upgrade to a newer machine, you may want to consider selling it. **There are several avenues available for selling you old machine**, including yard sales, online ads and even used appliance dealers to name a few.
- **Donate it!** Numbers of non-profit organizations have facilities that often include a kitchen or dining area. **Maybe one of them could benefit from a "new" dishwasher?** Missions, shelters, and other facilities might be good places to check.
- **Recycle it!** If your machine is broken and beyond repair, there is still a better option than taking your dead dishwasher to the **Tehama County/Red Bluff Landfill**. Dishwashers, like most household appliances, lend themselves quite well to being recycled. Once a dishwasher is dismantled and potentially hazardous parts are removed, **the bulk of its components are metals that can be used for scrap metal.**
