Select to opt out of receiving Tehama County's 4Rs News monthly e-newsletter. WISH-CYCLING is the practice of tossing questionable items in the recycling bin, hoping it can be recycled. 'Better safe than sorry' has been the wish-cycling mantra in America since recycling began gaining ground in the 1970's. Wish-cycling has increased over the years, and now one in four items put in the recycling bin is actually trash.

Wish-cycling might start with the best of intentions, but it is one of the biggest issues facing waste management today. When a batch of recyclables is contaminated with food or liquid, there is a good chance it will be rejected and end up buried in a landfill. In other words, that one item we *tried* to recycle, turns tons of properly recycled items into trash. Let's do better!
