DID YOU KNOW?

Do you have some things to get rid of after doing your Spring cleaning? You may be able to find a new home or a new use for some of the things you're thinking of getting rid of.

- Donating or selling used furniture is a great way to conserve landfill space and save money. Every day, the landfill buries couches, chairs, desks and other pieces of furniture. Some of these items could have been given a second life. Ask your friends and family if they could use any furniture. Selling furniture online is also a good way to get rid of furniture that you no longer need.
- Donating gently used clothing to thrift stores is a good way to keep clothing out of landfills. If you have clothes with stains or holes, bring them to the landfill and put them in our clothing recycling bin. You can also do eco-friendly sewing projects with old textiles like sheets and pillowcases, like reusable produce bags and reusable cloth napkins.
- Tubs and jars make great food storage containers. Instead of placing them in your blue cart, try using them for food storage or for shopping at stores that sell bulk food items. If you have your containers weighed at the register, then you'll be able to fill them up with bulk items without being charged for the weight of the container. This is a great way to reduce waste since you won't be using store-provided plastic bags.
- Do you have plastic plant pots? Try returning them to garden supply retailers so that they can be reused. Just make sure to call first and confirm that they will be accepted. Some retailers will also send off for recycling returned pots that are too damaged to be reused.
